formed Ménard that the interest generated that night alone would allow B.G.O. to sell out the issue.

Meanwhile, B.G.O. became involved with the Seven Arts project, and some of the administrators of the two companies were the same. Seven Arts (an innovative project which was to fund several unnamed features with monies, gathered through a public offering, much like a mutual fund) was running into difficulties, and the closing date for the Seven Arts offering was put off repeatedly.

Meanwhile, B.G.O. refused to proceed with the issue on Une journée, insisting that Seven Arts would provide the funding once its issue was sold. There is the suggestion that potential investors in Une journée were encouraged by B.G.O. to invest in Seven Arts instead.

The upshot was that the Seven Arts issue fell seriously short of its goal (raising only \$4 million some of an anticipated \$10 million), and B.G.O., having lended all its energies to the Seven Arts issue, had no interest, energy or time to sell the units for Une journée.

No funds were forthcoming from Seven Arts to finance Une journée, and B.G.O. failed to sell a single unit, despite the producer's efforts to provide all the necessary papers and to participate in a sales campaign.

Ménard is left with an unfinished (and for the moment, and unfinishable film), and is suing for \$1,143,549 in damages.

Pierre Thibeault, once interim director of the Canadian Film Development Corp., is handling the cause for Ménard at the firm of Martineau, Walker in Montreal.

Alberta gives green light to little offering

EDMONTON - Alberta has approved its first public issue of film units for a cost of \$1.000 each 2.500 units are being offered to finance the Fil Fraser-Jack Wynters \$2.5 million production of 4x4. It is believed to he the first time in Canada, that a public issue of film units has been offered at a cost of less than \$5,000 per unit.

The \$1,000 offering has been designed to make film investment - and tax deferral - available to a winder range of Albertans than were previously able to take advantage of the capital cost allowance," said the film's producer, Jack Wynters. "We feel that there are many people in the province who would like to participate in the development of the film industry in western Canada, and this represents an opportunity at a relatively low cost."

4x4 Productions Ltd., the company offering the units, is jointly owned by Fraser Film Associates and Jack Wynters' Productions Ltd., both of Edmonton. 


