Where the two companies are different, the name of the production company, if known, is also given. In instances where a producer has asked us not to list a project, or to withhold certain credits due to ongoing negotiations, we have respected his request. The guide only lists productions or series whose duration will be one hour or over.

Canadian Screen Institute to train filmmakers

MONTREAL - In an exclusive to *Cinema Canada*, Andy Thomson, former executive producer of the National Film Board's Drama Studio in Montreal, has announced the formation of the Canadian Screen Institute, a new national institution dedicated to training promising young film-makers in drama. The official announcement was to be made April 23 in Edmonton.

Inspired by the success of Dramalab, an experimental training program begun by Thomson, Tom Radford, executive producer of the NFB's northwest studio in Ed-monton, and Jan Miller of ACTRA, the CSI will draw promising young teams of would-be producers/directors/screenplay writers from the five major Canadian regions (the Maritimes, Quebec, Ontario, the Prairies and British Columbia). These teams will consist of individuals training to make dramatic films but who have had at least two years of professional experi-ence in a related domain. "A production manager, for exam-ple, might be a good candidate to become a producer," ex-plains Thomson. "Or a pub-lished short-story writer a screenplay writer, a profes-sional theatre director a film director, and so on."

Applications, including portfolios of applicants' work, will be screened by a selection committee, after which a na-tional selection board will travel across the country to meet the candidates. From each region a team of three will be selected: a future pro-ducer, director and writer.

In the first phase, the teams will study film drama in a class-room situation at the Univer-sity of Alberta's Edmonton campus. This program will be designed by leading filmmak-ers and will focus around a story-oriented creative ap-proach. Some of the filmmak-ers who have already partici-pated in the former Dramalab program include Janice Platt and Allan King.

During phase one, trainees will be paid expenses and a modest honorarium, and dur-ing phase two the going NFB rates apply, while standard CBC contracts will apply for phase three.

Administration of the pro-gram will include a Board of Di-rectors made up of the various agencies concerned, a manage-ment committee, an executive director and his or her execu-tive assistant. At least tem-porarily, administrative head-quarters for the CSI will be on-campus at the University of Al-berta. A five-year plan, to be finalized at a later date, will give the CSI its overall direc-tion.

In a second phase, the teams will move on to the NFB's main studios in Montreal for a hands-on-approach for a four-or five - month session, where they will be provided with a pool of actors and crew. Here they will work, under the close supervision of a creative con-sultant, to create a film drama of about 15 minutes' duration.

In a third and final phase, each team will return to their region where, again under the supervision of an executive producer, they will write, di-rect and produce a half-hour

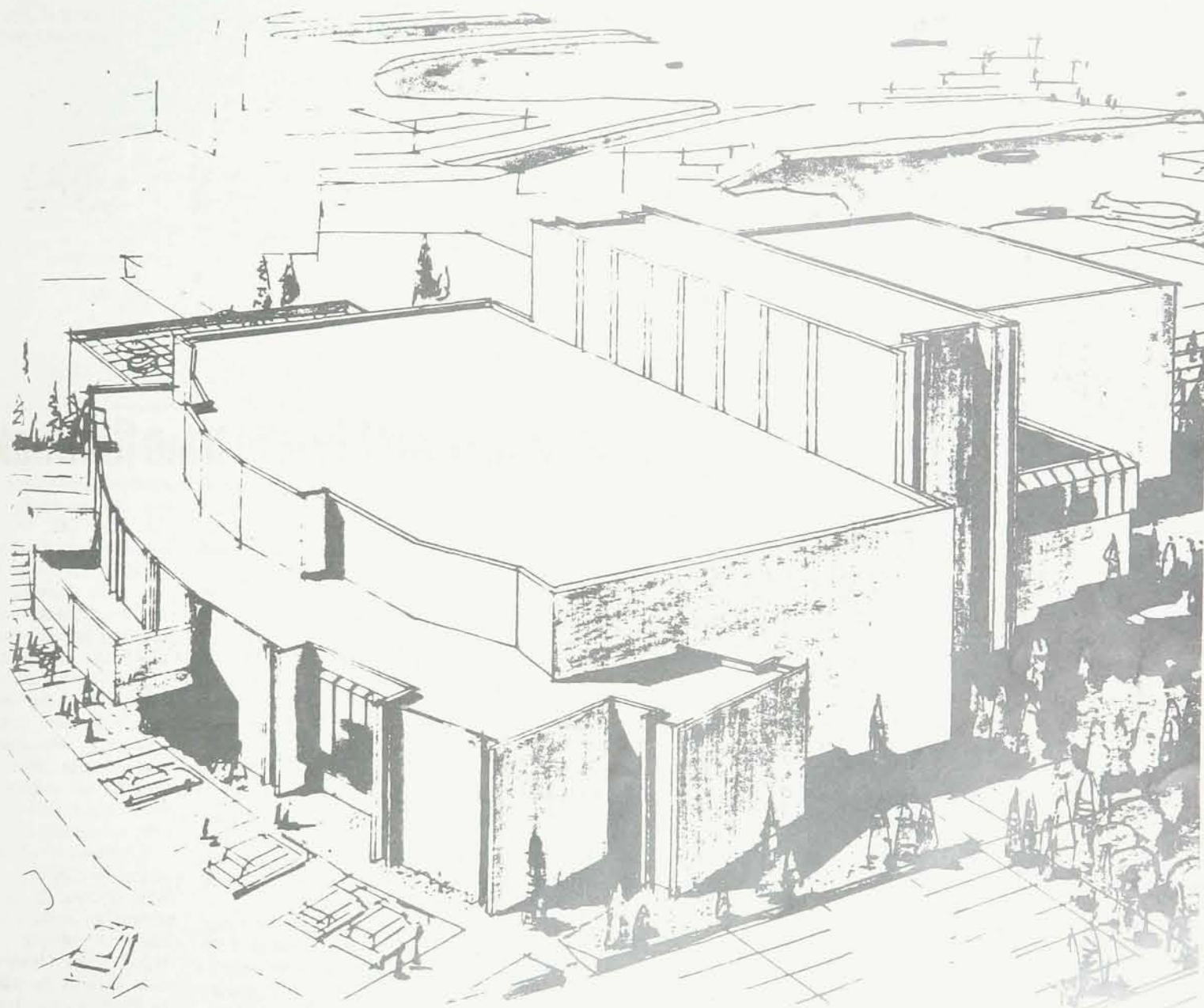
television drama for the Cana-dian Broadcasting Corpora-tion. The CBC reserves the right to "only finance a script that they like", says Thomson, and it is therefore to each team's advantage to "do the very best job that they can."

The CSI hopes that by be-coming a national institution, separate from the NFB, and de-dicated to the formation of would-be filmmakers, the training gap that currently exists in this country's film in-dustry will be filled. Thomson, now president of Norwolf Film Corporation, explains that for drama "we have a very hard time finding good Canadian writers to write our scripts." Talented people, especially those from little-populated areas such as the Maritimes or the Prairies, often have to go to the larger urban centers for training from which they often never return. "In this country" says Thomson, "our most ur-gent need is to create a forum on drama. We hope to fill the gap that exists between the kid fresh out of film school and the filmmaker of solid experi-ence."

Financing for the CSI will come from different sources, including the provinces separ-ately, the federal Department of Communications, Telefilm, the NFB, the CBC, and others. Specific agreements as to financing have not as yet been finalized.

A national advertising cam-paign will run this summer to familiarize all Canadians with the existence and purpose of CSI, inviting talented people to apply.
