CBC DOCUDRAMA UNDER FIRE

In 1977, the CBC aired Peter Pearson's The Tar Sands, a docudrama that depicted Peter Lougheed's negotiation of the 1974 Syncrude agreement. Lougheed claimed the production depicted him as incompetent and subsequently sued. According to Seth Feldman, there weren't large distortions in the film but there were some factual inaccuacies and the CBC was forced to settle. Feldman examines the ramifications of the event on the docudramas the CBC has produced 16 since then.
