Projects are separated into four categories: On Location, Pre-production, Projects in Negotiation, and In the Can. While films in the project stage are subject to change, only those in active pre-production at the time of publication - those which have set a date for beginning principal photography and are also engaged in casting and crewing - are listed under Pre-production. The In Negotiation section is published every other month due to lack of turnover in projects. Films are listed by the name of the company which initiated the project, or by the company that is popularly associated with it. The production company is not necessarily the same company which initiated or is associated with the project.

When two companies are different, the name of the production company, if known, is given. If producers ask us not to list a project or to withhold certain credits because of ongoing negotiations, we respect their request. Kelly says NABET 800 is currently negotiating with four producers to crew projects in B. C. He expects six or seven shoots before the end of the year and feels there is going to be room for his union, IATSE and the recently formed Vancouver branch of ACFC even if the competitive advantage of the Canadian dollar is reduced.

"The (American) majors will always make pictures in this country because they don't have union disputes and fights. It'll always be attractive even at 10 per cent (difference between the dollars).

"(Producers) need to get out of Hollywood because it's non-productive to make films there. Hollywood, specifically Burbank, is full of sitcoms and series. It's uneconomical to make pictures in Los Angeles because of the studio crewing contracts.

Kelly also told Cinema Canada that NABET has been talking with Cannell Films. He says the union and the company signed an interim letter of intent to use NABET crews in line with current practice in the U.S. Cannell and IATSE are involved in lengthy talks aimed at negotiating preferential rates for Cannell productions.

ACFC-Vancouver yet to sign producers

VANCOUVER - The Vancouver office of the Association of Canadian Film Craftspeople (ACFC) has signed up 185 members but, as of our deadline, had not reached agreement with any producers. The new association has also undergone a change of leadership; president Tom Evans resigned and has been replaced by Ray Hache, a former IATSE grip/construction permittee.

ACFC has approved a basic rate sheet which guarantees hourly rates between \$40 for a director of photography, \$18 for a head carpenter, \$15 for a seamstress/tailor and \$10 for most training positions. Most of the rates are slightly below IATSE, a policy that runs counter to ACFC's initial determination not to undercut the senior union.

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


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
