

CALGARY

TREVOR PAIGE (Affiliate) - completed a 15 minute colour featurette in 16mm titled Rendezvous; three colour documentaries for Flextrac Nodwell Ltd. -Mark II, TT 600, and TT 100 running 21-15-10 minutes respectively; and a feature-length colour travelogue in 16mm called Alberta Adventure. He is currently working on Canada the Northern Giant, a 16mm colour travelogue scheduled for completion in 1974. Mr. Paige's future work includes a 16mm colour featurette to be shot on location in Vancouver, Calgary and Chicago entitled Aged with Innocence which he wrote and is producing. In April, he will be filming Ole London Towne on location in England with Chris Pullen for a colour travelogue. By June, shooting will begin on Cabbie, a 35mm colour feature. Locations include Vancouver, Los Angeles and San Francisco. The \$400,000 production, based on an original story by Trevor Paige, will be produced by him and Richard Goldstein. This feature is presently in the final stages of scripting.

EDMONTON

C.N. ROSS – was Executive Producer on A Taste of Alberta. He is currently producing A Slightly Different World, and will be the Executive Producer on Ski Alberta.

MONTREAL

JIM GRATTAN – completed filming Girls' Hockey in Massport, a Farm Nutrite commercial, Bell Canada, and Ice Fishing for the CBS. He is currently working on a film for Brinco Corporation, Dollars and Cents for the CBC, the Women's National Curling Championships, and footage for CTV's W-5 Programme.

ARNOLD E. HAGUE – shot film of the CN Tower in Toronto, and large freight loads in Montreal; both for CN **Review '73**. He is working on a training film for television on Ottawa hotel chefs, and a film on rebuilding locomotives for television news. His upcoming assignments include various items for **CN 50 Years' Film.** He will be retiring from CN Railroads at the end of June after 16 years with CN and 31 years with Associated Screen News. GEORGE BALOGH – completed shooting commercials for Shell Corporate. He is presently shooting Neo-Citran commercials and will be soon doing Westinghouse commercials. All of these are with a full IATSE crew.

DOUGLAS CONNELL (Affiliate) – was focus-puller on the Neptune Factor with an IATSE crew. He's currently doing the focus-pulling for CBC's National Dream.

DAVID KELLY – completed his assignment as assistant cameraman on Columbia Pictures' Last Detail. The feature was shot in Norfolk, Richmond, Washington, New York, Boston and Toronto. He is currently shooting commercials for Cinera. His future assignment? Resting!

DAVID M. OSTRIKER - completed working on Hobel-Leiterman's Here Come the 70's for CBC; Walrus for the Ontario Educational Communications Authority - a one-hour documentary; and OECA's special Club of Rome. He was the Director of Photography on all three assignments. He is presently DOP on Philosophy for the People, two halfhour dramas produced by OECA. His upcoming work includes being DOP on an industrial for Coleman, an Inglis industrial, and commercials for Sommerset Productions.
